It is crucial for Germany to define what it expects from its relationship with the US and what its respective priorities are - irrespective of who will be in the White House. Three specific issue areas stand out from a German perspective: the future of European Security and the relationship with Russia, dealing with failed statehood in the Middle East, and finally the transatlantic dialogue about key powers in the international system, especially China. The presentation will reflect and build upon the results of a strategic reflection group on a "Transatlantic Agenda 2016 to 2018" that convened in the German Foreign Office at the end of 2015. Marcus Overhaus is an expert on security issues affiliated with the German Institute for International and Security Affairs (SWP). He has recently completed a sabbatical project with the Policy Planning Staff of the German Foreign Office and was a Fulbright Scholar.
